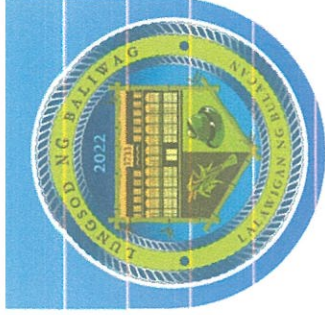

INSPECTION REPORT

Name of Establishment: REMIL FARM

Address: Orchids St. Matangtubig, Baliwag, Bulacan

Issue: FLIES INFESTATION COMPLAINT

Date of inspection: June 20, 2025 an inspection was conducted by the CAO-Veterinary Division and CENRO

Inspection Report: A complaint was received via social media platform that the alleged farm was the cause of flies infestation in the nearby housing area located at the right lateral portion of the farm. The farm has a total broiler capacity of 12,000 heads but manage to load the building for a total of 10,000 heads.

Findings:

With load. The farm started last June 13, 2025 and the alleged flies infestation was not observed in the area during this time were the broiler chickens was still days old but the near harvest season the flies infestation started and lasted again for 7 to 21 days to the neighbors around the vicinity of the farm.

Monitoring of the nearby establishment for the allege broiler farm for flies'infestation outside the neighboring residents. So far since the farm newly loaded there was minimal flies observed in the premises of the establishment.

In regards with the above mentioned issues, CAO VET DIV cited the following recommendations to address the said issues. The lists of recommendations are as follows:

Recommendations:

- Continue implementation of strict recommended schedule for fly control to avoid reoccurrence. One week before harvest and one week after harvest.
- Continue practicing strict biosecurity measures.
- Advise to report to the City Agriculture Office for their flock population flock harvest including follow up this coming harvest season preferably on July 01- 10, 2025 as coordinated with the farm manager's schedule. Requesting the certifications/permits of the manure processed and to future harvesting of broiler should be coordinated with the City and Provincial Veterinary Office for proper documentations.

Also, we will conduct a follow up monitoring on the said establishments to ensure their compliance with the following ordinances

- Animal Welfare Act
- Avian Influenza Provincial Ordinance
